This 14-member choir is truly international with members from Israel, South Africa and the United States. The choir is scheduled to provide a cappella "Shomer Shabbat" music at the Savannah Shabbaton, scheduled for May 6 and 7 at the JEA.

The choir as a fundraising source for local and Israeli charities singing at weddings, functions and concerts nationwide. The choir's goal is to archive its' repertoire in a library of Jewish music.
